GENERAL BUSINESS	<p>1] DA 2017/20 – discussion and update by Michael Coulter General Manger Nambucca Shire Council  VBCA have community based sent a letter with objections (lack of recreational space).  Open space should be central and usable but developer has not resolved on this issue.  Ceri Wroble – Open space. Variable buffer zone to wetland. Issue of trees and what is to be cleared.</p> <p>2] High Way noise Petition – where are we?  Peter Sobey addressed NSC on 16 Mar with aim to have a Council representative present with any future meeting with Melinda Pavey. The Council passed a motion to this effect.</p> <p>3]Anderson Park – Grants and Shade Cover Tables &amp; Valla Reserve Contracts for the shade placed by NSC – should be finished by the end of March (weather permitting). Shades at Lions Park will have to wait till next year.</p> <p>3a] Drainage at Anderson Park  NSC have organised Pipes and filling but VBCA funds are depleted due to the Shades etc. We do not have enough money at the moment. The quote for the earthworks was higher than anticipated.</p> <p>4 TAFE Lions Club &amp; VBCA project Benches  All the benches are finished and NSC will position them. Waiting for the concrete pads to be completed by Council.</p> <p>5] Market Report – Site prices to go up this market and permanent sites have been implemented which has pleased most stall holders. Music Royalties?- NSC looking into this. Michael reports that no movement has occurred on this issue.</p> <p>6] Hall.- Grant for upgrade Air Con, Curtains Stove &amp; Fridge has been approved. This is a 50/50 grant money not available until about mid-April after the shades completed.  Hall booking forms are being updated but rates to stay the same.</p> <p>7] FOSH –VBCA involvement –  VBCA will be donating \$500.00 and will help if required.</p> <p>8] Carols – 2017 Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December  Daphne spoke about the event. Very successful last year. Money was</p>

donated to local groups (Nambucca Valley Brass Band, Valla Beach Rural Fire Service, Valla Voices, Men's Shed).

**9] Any other business**

9a] Note from Ceri & Richard Wrobel –

Ceri spoke to her concerns that had previously been sent to the committee.

The 90kmh sign south of Valla Beach road on Giinagay Way is too close and needs to be moved further south. See Motions from the Floor below.

Ceri to write to the sliders/drifters car club requesting that they improve their behaviour when staying at the resort.

Dog poo. Highlight in the next Valla Views that some people need to clean up after their pet.

9b] CDAT – funding may be reduced – Tracy Suter. Change of rules means that to get money we need to partner with two other groups. Lions and Valla Hall? Tracy to investigate further.

9c] Asbestos at Deep Creek. Bunting and signs have disintegrated. Michael Coulter takes note.

9d] Exploration licence EL-6702 has been relinquished. Rumoured April release of North Coast Plan.

9e] Tim Woodward and Matt La Brant re. Removal of trees at Jones Reserve. (Done at the start of the meeting)

Vegetation has been vandalised. Plan is to revegetate and monitor but may have to put up screens. Suspect may have been Council spraying of paspalam. Die back happens after spraying. Some are not happy that accusations of residents deliberately poisoning trees for views.

Plan to have site visit so that any interested parties can view.

9f] Gravel washed over intersection of Giinagay Way and Valla Beach Road. Council has had complaints from cyclists and the Council may organise street sweeper.

9g] Bourkes Lane has a 1km at the end that is 80kmh. This is too fast for the conditions.

Advertise for the next meeting so that a motion can be discussed with more of the residents.

9h] Radio station now operating from the tennis club. Will take community announcements.

Motion to have the Kuta Avenue bus stop relocated to near Anderson Park in a level area to make it safer for children. Seconded Gary Suter.</p> <p>Motion carried unanimously.</p>
